**Pot Plants, Roses & Cut Flowers will be received by the stewards between 2pm & 6:30pm on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> May 2026.**

**Roses & Cut flower entries will also be accepted Friday morning 8<sup>th</sup> May from 7am, but they must be benched by 9:15am.**

All entries displayed in the Roses, Cut Flowers, Collections & Pot Plants must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least last six weeks prior to the Show.

For Floral Art Class, (Class 44), flowers & foliage do not have to be home grown.

Bottles & Exhibitor Labels for entries will be available from the Showgrounds during Show Week.

It is suggested exhibitors bring in their entries bottled and labeled. Please note that exhibits that are tall or top heavy are required to be suitably & securely presented, so there is no risk of the entry toppling over.

-Exhibit Labels are to be placed on front of exhibit with clear tape so the underside can be read. On the front of the label is the Class number & plant name. eg Class 45 Dahlia. On the back of the label is the Exhibitors Name.

ALL Collections must be exhibited in a Florist bowl or plastic take away container & oasis (Your own container). Entries presented in vases, bottles, etc, will not be accepted by the stewards.

### BIOSECURITY QUEENSLAND

Fire Ant Movement Controls as of 1 July 2016, the Biosecurity Act 2014 (the Act) and the Biosecurity Regulation 2016 (the Regulation) came into effect. Therefore, all exhibits and/or any plant and soil material that are being transported from these zones must be appropriately treated. Management Techniques Insecticide treatments and the correct storage of potted plants are the two key options to reduce the risk of fire ants in potted plants. Treatment Applying an appropriate treatment to potted plants helps minimise the risk of fire ant infestation. All insecticides must be used in accordance with the conditions of the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) permit and in conjunction with the product's label. You can search for permits on the APVMA website at [www.apvma.gov.au](http://www.apvma.gov.au).

Granular insecticides in potting media If using bifenthrin or chlorpyrifos in potting media, the product's dosage rate determines the protection period. Bifenthrin can protect potted plants for more than 24 months, and chlorpyrifos for up to 12 months. Drenching or dipping the protection period varies depending on the insecticide used, such as: Bifenthrin provides 28 days protection Cyfluthrin provides 72 hours protection Chlorpyrifos provides 28 days protection
