• All exhibits of grain to be in buckets or other suitable containers and must be true to type (buckets preferred).

• **Exhibits that are to be named must be named by Exhibitor on a plain label attached to the Exhibit or it will be disqualified by judge or stewards.**

• **Sheaves, Heads and Green Bundles to be tied securely with 2 or more pieces of string or zip ties.**

• **Honey to be presented for judging in plastic or glass, round or square 500g jars, with plastic lids only, without labels attached (Safe Food Standard) or will be disqualified.**

• No produce to appear in a section which it has been previously displayed over two consecutive years.

• Judging to commence at 9.30am on Friday 10th May 2024.

• Collection of exhibits at 4.30pm on Saturday 11th May 2024 **MUST BE CHECKED WITH STEWARDS BEFORE TAKING.**

• **All prize money must be claimed from the secretary's office before 5pm Saturday.**

NB: The secretary's office will close at 5pm Saturday evening 11th May 2024.
