- Exhibits will not be accepted on Friday morning.
- All exhibits of grain to be in buckets or other suitable containers and must be true to type (buckets preferred).
- **Classes with AOV (any other variety) & exhibits that are to be named must be named by Exhibitor on a plain label attached to the Exhibit or it will be disqualified by judge or stewards.**
- **Sheaves, Heads and Green Bundles to be tied securely with 2 or more pieces of string or zip ties.**
- **Honey to be presented for judging in plastic or glass, round or square 500g jars, with plastic lids only, without labels attached (Safe Food Standard) or will be disqualified.**
- No produce to appear in a section which it has been previously displayed over two consecutive years.
- Judging to commence at 9.30am on Friday 8th May 2026.
- Collection of exhibits at 4.30pm on Saturday 9th May 2026 MUST BE CHECKED WITH STEWARDS BEFORE TAKING.
- **All prize money must be claimed from the secretary's office before 5pm Saturday.**
- **The secretary's office will close at 6pm Saturday evening 9th May 2026.**

1. Create a new account or login to your existing account
 - If you have forgotten your password, please use the forgotten password feature.
2. Select CROWS NEST SHOW
3. Click on PLACE AN ENTRY
4. Click on INDIVIDUAL ENTRY
5. In Entrant Name select your Entrant from the drop down or click on ADD NEW to add a new entrant to your account
 - a. If clicking Add New fill out your Entrants name. Other fields are optional
6. In EXHIBIT TYPE select INDOOR / DISPLAY
7. Click on SELECT CLASSES
8. From the drop down choose the Section you would like to enter
9. On the pop up TICK the box to accept the entry notes and conditions for this section
10. Click the PLUS symbol beside the section you are entering to expand to the classes
11. Click on the class or classes you are entering to select them
